BOB FELLMAN – OLD GLORY HONOR FLIGHT

Bob Fellman, a retired local businessman, joined us on Monday morning to tell us about his recent experience with the Old Glory Honor Flight Program. Bob took an Honor Flight last fall and he gave us a detailed description of what he saw and when they did what when they visited the WW II Memorial in Washington, DC. Bob joined the Army Air Corp when he was 18 years old and he was a gunner on a B-29 bomber.

The inaugural Honor Flight took place in May of 2005. Six small planes flew out of Springfield, Ohio taking twelve World War II veterans on a visit to the memorial in Washington, DC. In August of 2005, an ever-expanding waiting list of veterans led the transition to commercial airline carriers with the goal of accommodating as many veterans as possible. Partnering with HonorAir in Hendersonville, North Carolina, the "Honor Flight Network" was formed. The Mission Statement of “Honor Flight Network” is to: *Transport America's veterans to Washington, D.C. to visit those memorials dedicated to honor their service and sacrifices.* Their Goal is to: *Help every single veteran in America, willing and able of getting on a plane or a bus, to visit THEIR memorial.*

OLD GLORY HONOR FLIGHT (cont’d)

Old Glory Honor Flight is the Northeast Wisconsin hub of the Honor Flight Network. Their mission is to offer World War II veterans a memorable, safe and rewarding tour of honor to our Nation's Capital. Each Honor Flight departs Northeast Wisconsin (Appleton or Oshkosh) and returns on the same day after visiting several sites around Washington, DC. Most importantly, the veterans are able to visit those memorials dedicated in their honor including the World War II Memorial, the Iwo Jima Memorial, the Korean War Memorial, and the Vietnam War Memorial, as well as Arlington National Cemetery. The World War II Memorial was recently dedicated in 2004, and far too many of our Nation's heroes never had the chance to visit their memorial. Honor flights have one guardian for every two veterans to take care of their needs throughout the day. A medical staff including a doctor and several nurses are available if needed. Wheelchairs and all meals are also provided. Steve Millin also added a personal footnote to Bob’s presentation by telling us of his father-in-law’s recent Honor Flight out of Madison.
